

BISHOP'S MONTHLY REFLECTION

October 2024

-October - The Month of Assurance and Consolation

"Only Jesus can save us from condemnation!" Our Assurance! Our Lady of the Rosary: She will lead us to God! Our Consolation "I am the salvation of the people, says the Lord. Should they cry to me in any distress, I will hear them, and I will be their Lord forever." (Entrance Antiphon 25th Sunday)

Life is precious. Life is sanctified. We are created in the very Image of God. Our Loving and Merciful God who is invisible became visible by taking on human flesh -human life - in the Incarnation. The God of the universe was confined to the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary for nine months and was born, immersed, into the messiness of this world. He did not come to condemn this world, but he came to save it from sin and its destructive power.

Becase life is precious, we are obligated to *respect* life and to uphold human dignity. This *incarnate* God, Jesus, is *hope* for the sinner and Judge and Victor over sin and death. All sin, great and small, is an offense against God and his love. From the Garden of Eden to the present moment, the *culture of life* has been under a relentless attack from the devious tactics of the *culture of death*. It continues to strike at the very foundation of society: marriage and family life. The culture of death will continue to be emboldened and empowered as long as individuals choose to turn away from God and ignore his commandments and moral codes.

The preeminent attack against the sanctity of life - abortion - assaults the most vulnerable - the innocent ones - those conceived in the wombs of their mothers - the *unborn*. What an abhorrent abomination against our God, the Creator! This is *the* great offense against the Lord of Life. How far can this disregard for human life and dignity, this killing of the unborn, continue without us witnessing the hand of God's justice?

The reality is: as long as humanity, and those who govern us, continue to push God and his moral teachings aside, we will forfeit the gifts of grace and mercy and, in turn, will face the consequences of this sin as it is loudly and arrogantly proclaimed as *freedom to choose!* It's a freedom to choose to terminate, to kill a child, an unborn human life, all in the name of it being perceived as "a right" to resolve a problem, to address an inconvenience to one's livelihood, basically, a *final solution* to an unwanted pregnancy.

We are reminded by Bishop Michael F. Burbidge, the USCCB's Chairman of the Committee Pro-Life Activities, that for fifty years of national access to abortion, "it has tragically created a national mindset where many Americans have become comfortable with some amount of abortion." Bishop Burbidge continues: "We must call for policies that assist women and their children in need, while also continuing to help mothers in our own communities through local pregnancy help centers," adding that Catholics must "extend the hand of compassion" to those who participated in an abortion.

If one realizes it or not, the consequences, the "wake-up call," of the impact of this sin has mysteriously contributed to all the senseless division, unrest, hated, violence, lawlessness, and war that we are experiencing. It is all, somehow, interrelated.

In the United States, alone, abortion is responsible for the destruction of 1 million American lives a year! Can you image what the number is on a worldwide scale? What will be the repercussions of this sin? Could it possibly lead to a horrific scenario for the human race. St. Mother Teresa had thoughts on this. She was known to have stated, in a prophetic tone, that the punishment the world would face, for the sin of abortion, would be - war - nuclear war! Is this the endgame resulting from an unrepentant attitude toward the sin of abortion? My friends, some of you might think this is a farfetched scenario? But observing the present state of affairs in our world, this is not farfetched! Many things are happening in our world to "get our attention, to alert us! We simply need to "read the signs of the times."

Together, let us pray for our country as we approach our national elections. As Catholics, let us approach the voting booths as faithful citizens with well-formed consciences. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops are inviting us to acknowledge October, Respect Life Month, with "a revival of prayer and action." For I believe there is a dark spiritual cause behind all the division and hatred we are experiencing as the citizens of this country, and among those who govern us. As long as abortion continues to be "showcased" by political parties, we will continue to experience a sense of confusion, uncertainty and unrest among us as a nation and world.

Why are some who are in power so obsessed with abortion? Why are they so committed to promote the killing of unborn children under the guise of so-called reproductive healthcare and a woman's reproductive rights? Why would they be willing to forfeit the cost, the loss of potential blessings that could come from future generations born to this nation? Where is this desire to celebrate abortion coming from?! This is nothing short of what Sr. Lúcia dos Santos, visionary of Fatima, described as "diabolical disorientation." If not addressed, this will lead to a greater disrespect of human life and dignity which will result in more chaos. Our Catholic vote can make a difference for the future of the United States of America.

I would like to share a quote from Matthew Kelly included in his recent book: 33 Days to Eucharistic Glory - "When we are not willing to even listen to the other side of an argument, we dangerously open ourselves to deception and tyranny of the worst kind. When a culture begins to deny objective reality, it is teetering on the edge of destruction. This is the attitude of today's culture - and not only in relation to matters of faith. The poverty of mind and spirit has descended so low that this is now the attitude of the culture toward objective truths and scientific and biological realities."

So, what is the culprit and source behind this "poverty of mind and spirit? Mental illness? Spiritual disorientation? Spiritual darkness?

In the midst of all of this, we are called, during the month of October, to pray for God's mercy. We must call upon God's intervention. Let us recommit to pray the Rosary during October. May Our Lady of the Rosary of Fatima intercede for us in a powerful way during our challenging and troubled times. As Our Lady consoled Lúcia, so she consoles and reminds us that she is *our refuge*, and she, Our Lady of the Rosary, will *lead us to God*.

During this month of October, let us also turn to the Shepherd Children of Fatima, asking them to pray for us to be true disciples of the Lord of Life. We are called to be *Pilgrims of Hope*. We are called to be *Disciples of Life!* Are we not blessed that the parents of the children of Fatima chose life for them and not death! How many tens of millions of children who were not permitted to be born into this world, potentially, could have been other Jacinta's, Francisco's, and Lúcia's for the world?! What a travesty! Who is going to take responsibility for this? Who will pay the price for this "disorientation" of the use of the gift of free will and the supposed freedom to choose?

Let us be determined, as faithful Catholic citizens, to approach the upcoming elections and vote as committed promoters of life! Our Catholic vote can make a difference and an impact on the future of our Nation and help secure religious liberty among us. Let us pray for our politicians. There is much at stake. Let's "bend a knee" in prayer as we prepare to cast our vote and remember: "In you, Lord, is the source of life...."

For the sake of your sorrowful passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world!



The Common Good



In their statement on Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, the Catholic bishops of the United States identify the four main principles of the Church's social teaching and apply them to some concrete issues. This is not to tell the faithful for whom or against whom to vote, but instead to help them form their consciences in accordance with God's truth as they approach this often-challenging decision. The four main principles are the Dignity of the Human Person, the Common Good, Solidarity, and Subsidiarity. They are all interrelated. This bulletin focuses on the Common Good, and the other three principles are covered in three other bulletins in this series. —★

The Common Good is "the sum total of social conditions which allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfillment more fully and more easily." Human dignity is respected and the common good is fostered only if human rights are protected and basic responsibilities are met. Every human being has a right to life, a right to religious freedom, and a right to have access to those things required for human decency.

Corresponding to these rights are duties and responsibilities—to ourselves, to our families, to the larger society, and to the earth.² In short, we should seek "to build that kind of society where it is easier for people to be good."³

In the midst of a "throwaway world" in which some members of the human family "can be readily sacrificed for the sake of others considered worthy of a carefree existence," Pope Francis urges us to build a "culture of encounter" in which those most in need receive our greatest concern and attention. We must "place at the center of all political, social and economic activity the human person, who enjoys the highest dignity, and respect for the common good."

As we seek to imitate the Good Samaritan, who was neighbor to all, we pursue the Common Good in order that every individual and all people can flourish.⁵

 Marriage and the family are the central institutions of social life – the primary school of virtue, where we first experience common rather than merely individual goods – and so these institutions should be supported and strengthened.

- Likewise, as one human family dwelling in our common home, we must hear "both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor" and respond to climate change with actions to better protect creation for our brothers and sisters now and in generations to come.⁶
- Accepting the entire world as a gift from the Father, and as our common home includes accepting our bodies as God's gift, whereas thinking that we enjoy absolute power over our own bodies turns, often subtly, into thinking that we enjoy absolute power over creation.⁷
- We recognize and protect the right to religious liberty, our first and most cherished freedom. The protection of conscience and religious liberty is an indispensable element of the common good a fundamental human right that knows no geographical boundaries.⁸
- While the common good embraces all, those who are weak, vulnerable, and most in need deserve special concern, which the Church describes as the preferential option for the poor.9 Laws and policies must prioritize those who struggle to make ends meet and must preserve the social safety net and promote decent jobs, affordable housing, and childcare.

Pope Benedict XVI writes in Caritas in Veritate (Charity in Truth): "To desire the common good and strive towards it is a requirement of justice and charity." We must be attentive to the common good "juridically, civilly, politically and culturally" in the life of society. "The more we strive to secure a common good corresponding to the real needs of our neighbors," he writes, "the more effectively we love them." 10

Synod Corner

The second session of the Synod on Synodality began on October 2 and concludes on October 27. A retreat for all of the 400 participants preceded the Synod on September 30 to October 1. During the time between the first and second sessions, there have been five working groups and ten study groups preparing for the October 2024 Synod. The working groups have the responsibility of focusing on the immediate tasks and contribute to the discussions and developing the final document. The study groups delve deeper into the spe-



cific issues such as the role of women, the ecumenical journey, the synodal method and missionary synodal face of the Church and other issues. The central question guiding the study groups and the Synod in October is "How to be a synodal Church on mission?"

In July of this year, the *Instrumentum Laboris*, the working document, was sent to the participants for their study and preparation for the Synod. This 30-page document is based on the results of the First Session and material produced by the five Working Groups. The working document can be found on the Diocesan website at https://stocktondiocese.org/synod.
